





Sample Lesson* Marketing Yourself: Writing Your CV (20 minutes)

KS5 (ages 16-18)

Lesson Objectives:

To understand the purpose of a CV

 To understand how to promote yourself positively, through a CV







Activity 1: Starter

(2 mins)

As a class discuss:

- What does the word "CV" stand for?

- What is the purpose of a CV?







Activity 2: Look at CVs (1 min)

- Your teacher will put two different CVs* (face down) in front of you and your partner
- When told to start, you'll have exactly 30 seconds to read one and remember as many details as you can
- After 30 seconds, swap with your partner and do the same for the other
- At the end, you must turn both papers face down again.
- Ready?







Activity 3: Test your memory (1 min)

- We gave you 30 seconds as that is the amount of time an employer may look at each CV they receive
- Imagine both Anna and Bethany have applied to work as a sales assistant in a sports store. Who has the most relevant experience?
- Hands up for:
- Anna
- Bethany







Activity 4: Compare the CVs (6 mins)

- We're guessing that most people put their hand up for Anna.
 Employers certainly would like Anna's CV better.
- Yet, Bethany actually has more experience working in shops and more interest in sports, so might be a better candidate.
- Turn over both CVs and with your partner list reasons why Anna's CV communicates information better.







Activity 5: Compare your answers (2 mins)

- Reasons that Anna's communicates information better include:
- Snappy information in bullet points
- Bullet points start with an active verb
- Less irrelevant information
- Consistent formatting
- Use of subheadings
- Her CV also looks more professional:
- No spelling mistakes
- A sensible email address

Hands up if you identified most of these points?







Activity 6: Start thinking about your CV (5 mins)

- In the "Experience" part of your CV it's good to use the bullet points starting with "Active verbs" eg:
- Formed my school's Board Game club
- **Performed** in three concerts
- Raised £150 for Comic Relief
- Supported junior school children in reading
- *Contributed* articles to my school newspaper

Make a list of more short phrases starting with active verbs that could be used in a CV - see who can come up with the most







Plenary (3 mins)

- Share your phrases with the class. No one should read a sentence that has already used the same active verb
- How many has the class come up with?
