

Additional funding for disadvantaged students under the Turing scheme

If you are selected for an internship offered through the University of Oxford <u>Summer Internship</u> <u>Programme</u> which has Turing funds attached to it, your details will be passed to the Turing team who will assess eligibility for additional funds. Students who meet one or more of the following criteria will be eligible for additional funding:

- Students with an annual household income of £27,500 or less
- Students receiving Universal Credit or income-related benefits because they are financially supporting themselves or financially supporting themselves and someone who is dependent on them and living with them, such as a child or partner.
- Care leavers and students who are care-experienced.
- Students who have caring responsibilities. Caring responsibilities refers to a child or young person up to the age of 25 who provides (unpaid) care or intends to provide care for another person in, or outside of, the family home for someone who is physically or mentally ill, disabled, or misusing drugs or alcohol.
- Estranged Students
- Refugees and asylum seekers

SEND Funding

Specific funding is available for participants with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). This may include a sensory or mobility impairment, a long-term illness or health condition, or mental health condition, an autism spectrum condition, or a specific learning difficulty such as dyslexia, dyspraxia or ADHD.
